

Here are 25 key talking points from the Vancouver National Citizens Inquiry (NCI) Hearings into the safety of children in Canada. These points are drawn from witness testimony and analysis across the hearings and final report:

1. Breakdown in Parental Rights

Parents are often excluded from decisions regarding their children's education and medical choices, especially regarding gender identity and vaccination.

2. Ideological Bias in Education

Curriculum content increasingly reflects specific ideologies without balanced representation, contributing to parental concern and mistrust.

3. Lack of Informed Consent in Medical Decisions

Testimonies revealed that minors were subjected to medical procedures, including vaccination, without proper informed consent or parental involvement.

4. Psychological Harm from School Closures

Prolonged school closures during COVID-19 led to increased anxiety, depression, and "third bucket" children—those who disengaged entirely.

5. Student Academic Regression

Children experienced significant setbacks in literacy, numeracy, and social development due to remote learning and disrupted schooling.

6. Unprecedented Rise in Autism and Chronic Illness

Expert testimony indicated a disturbing rise in autism, ADHD, and other chronic conditions, with a suggested link to early childhood vaccinations.

7. Concerns Over mRNA Vaccine Safety

Dr. Jessica Rose and others raised concerns about DNA contamination and lack of dosing consistency in COVID-19 vaccines used on children.

8. Child Trafficking Allegations

Witnesses alleged that child protective services may be complicit in trafficking or re-trafficking children through broken systems.

9. Exposure to Sexually Explicit Content

Educational materials and online environments have introduced children to age-inappropriate sexual content, sometimes without parental knowledge.

10. Gender Ideology and Psychological Impact

Gender curriculum was reported to cause confusion and psychological distress among young children, with concerns over coercion in affirming identities.

11. Censorship of Dissenting Voices

Teachers and professionals who challenged institutional narratives around health or identity were reportedly silenced or penalized.

12. State-Controlled Science

Experts criticized government bodies for using selective data and narrative control to suppress scientific debate, especially around COVID-19 policies.

13. Medical Coercion and Lack of Transparency

Several testimonies highlighted coercion in vaccine uptake among youth, with limited disclosure of risks and side effects.

14. Governmental Absence and Accountability

Despite invitations, no government or regulatory officials participated in the Vancouver hearings, limiting official perspectives in the inquiry.

15. Risks of Online Predation

Children are increasingly exposed to cyberbullying, grooming, and invasive data collection online without sufficient safeguards.

16. Emotional and Spiritual Decline

Witnesses noted a decline in children's spiritual and emotional well-being, particularly due to isolation and disconnection during the pandemic.

17. Impact of International Policies

Transnational organizations like the UN were identified as influencing educational and health policies, raising concerns about loss of local autonomy.

18. Lack of Public Consultation on Curriculum

Changes in educational content, especially SOGI (Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity) curriculum, were often implemented without public dialogue.

19. Erosion of Academic Freedom

Schools were seen as increasingly hostile to viewpoints that diverge from official narratives, affecting students' freedom of thought and speech.

20. Vaccine Injury Underreporting

Testimonies alleged systemic underreporting of vaccine adverse events and insufficient mechanisms to monitor child health post-injection.

21. Suppression of Alternatives in Education

Educators discussed being penalized for offering non-mainstream perspectives or opting out of mandated content.

22. Institutional Pressure on Minors

Social and institutional pressures often led children to make significant medical decisions without adequate maturity or family support.

23. Influence of Corporate Interests in Health

Witnesses alleged that pharmaceutical and tech companies held undue influence over public health guidance, particularly around vaccines.

24. Sidelining of Trauma-Informed Practices

Children facing serious psychological harm—including trafficked or abused children—often lack access to trauma-informed services.

25. Lack of Judicial Oversight

Concerns were raised about judicial complicity in parental alienation cases and in the enforcement of public health orders affecting children.
